Glenn Henley, 79 years of age, of Peebles, went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, November 30, 2021, at his residence, with family by side.

Glenn was born on October 18, 1942, in Fairborn, Ohio, the son of the late Paul B and Virginia (Wall) Henley. Glenn graduated in 1962 from Fairborn High School, where he ran track and played football. He attended the University of Chattanooga and graduated from Kent State University in 1967. Glenn was a retired schoolteacher with the Adams County/Ohio Valley Schools. Glenn was a life-long member of the NRA and the National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association. He attended the Peebles Church of Christ. Glenn treasured spending time with his children and grandchildren, loved the outdoors, and enjoyed his property in Adams County.
