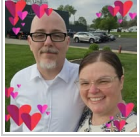

You taught me that our job here is to love one another and to always forgive. You taught me to cook. You taught me to use an iron skillet when it's that time of the month because "That extra iron does a girl's body good." You taught me to plant and grow things. You taught me that dogs are awesome! You taught me the joy of just sitting and reading the Bible. You taught me to call people out when they have wronged someone. You taught me how to work small livestock to put food on the table. I could go on and on. You always had our back. When we were going to be homeless, you all sent Uncle Sam over and moved us into your house without hesitation. Then you and papaw bought a trailer and sat it on your hillside for us. That's still one of the nicest places we ever lived. The year that Bo got hurt, you and Papaw making sure we had school clothes. The countless hours that we sat at your table and put puzzles together. The hundreds of times that all of us girls would talk and laugh until the wee hours of the night, with you right in the mix. Sometimes Papaw would wake up and tell us to get to bed. All the times sitting with you at the Seaman street fair. All the times riding to church and you would hand the chewing gum around the car. You only carried Freedent because it didn't stick to your dentures. Giving me Papaw's jacket when my legs would get cold while sitting in church. The patent leather dress shoes you always got us for Christmas so we always had church shoes that fit. Going to Rudd's Christmas Farm and walking thru the lights and drinking hot chocolate. The time we left there and almost hit a deer. Going to church way down in the boonies in Kentucky. The time you made veggie soup with deer meat and I didn't ask before I dipped a bowl. When I said that you had tricked me, you reminded me that I hadn't asked if it was hamburger or deerburger. Papaw laughed at me and then told me I better not waste that soup. Then you ate the bowl of it so I didn't have to. All the times you covered me in prayer. The times you called to check on me when you heard things weren't up to your liking. All the holidays at your homes, Abney Lane and Old 32. Laughing at us girls for not wanting to go out to the outhouse to

potty in the dark, before you had inside plumbing over there. The time JD and I surprised you with our spontaneous visit in October of 2020. You held my hand the entire rest of the church service. You hugged JD and patted his hand so many times. Most recently, our special chats and laughs that were just between me and you while I would help you get ready. We would giggle like school girls in your room. I am so blessed to have so many memories with you. I feel like I could write for days about all the memories we have shared. I love you so much, mamaw. I should have visited more the last nine months but I did just like everyone else. I got busy with my own life and now you're gone. All of those memories are worth more than any rare mineral or gem that this earth has to hold.
