Joyce Kay Wilson, 73 years of age, of Seaman, Ohio, passed away on Friday, June 14, 2024, at her residence, surrounded by her loving family.

Joyce was born on November 9, 1950, in Cincinnati, Ohio, the daughter of the late Paul and Catherine (White) Glasgow. Joyce worked as a registered nurse for the Adams County Regional Medical Center.
