William (Bill) Andrew Unger, 51, of Hanahan, South Carolina passed away on Wednesday, August 13, 2025, at his residence. Bill was born on February 24, 1974, in Covington, Tennessee, the son of Mary Lou (Cooper) Unger and the late Roger Unger.

Bill worked for Boeing in Charleston, South Carolina for 16 years with his most recent position as a 1st Shift Senior Operations Manager overseeing the following departments: Cranes, Tooling, Move Team, Moonshine Shop, Mylars, Weld Shop, and Tow Team. Bill was passionate about his job and was dedicated to the organization. He volunteered without reservation to help whenever it was needed. His dedication to the organization did not go unnoticed-- with Boeing flying a flag on August 13, 2025, in honor of his memory.

Those who knew Bill understood how passionate he was about his vehicles and that he changed and/or upgraded them every couple of years. While he enjoyed all these things, his greatest enjoyment was going to Ohio for vacation twice a year to have his mother and

sister cook his favorite meals and cater to him. Bill was very quick-witted and had a unique sense of humor and a laugh that drew people to him. However, he always had to have the last word and did not like to lose at anything, whether it was at golf or chili cook-offs.

Bill is survived by his mother, Mary Lou (Cooper) Unger of Peebles, Ohio; his sister, Kelly (Robbie) Powell; two nephews, Jonathan and Timothy Cox; and his best friend Poncho (his dog), all of Peebles, Ohio.
